Vote on the following propositions:

YES on Prop 128 – allows the legislature to amend ballot measures that contain unconstitutional or illegal language

YES on Prop 129 – requires ballot initiatives to pertain to a single subject

Prop 130 (No position)

YES on Prop 131 – creates the office of Lt. Governor, who would run on the same ticket as the Governor

YES on Prop 132 – requires at least 60% of the vote to pass any new tax or tax increase

NO on Prop 209 – excuses certain debts, shifting the burden to the taxpayers

NO on Prop 211 – requires private organizations to disclose their donors' information to the government, violating the Constitutional right to privacy and association

NO on Prop 308 – tuition amnesty for illegal immigrants

YES on Prop 309 – requires all voters to show valid photo ID

NO on Prop 310 – increases statewide sales tax
