Vote YES on Proposition 128 Allow adjustments to ballot-initiated laws (court rulings)	
Vote YES on Proposition 129 Allow only one subject per ballot initiative, prevents fraud	
Vote YES on Proposition 130 Exempts disabled veterans from paying property taxes	
Vote YES on Proposition 131 Establish office of Lt. Governor to protect we the people	
Vote YES on Proposition 132 Requires supermajority vote (60%) to raise state taxes	
Vote NO on Proposition 209 Excuses people from paying their debt, taxpayer funded	
Vote NO on Proposition 211 Requires private organizations disclose donations to gov't	
Vote NO on Proposition 308 Allows illegal immigrants subsidized college education	
Vote YES on Proposition 309 Voter ID Required for both in-person and mail-in-ballot voting	
Vote NO on Proposition 310 Raise state sales tax by 0.1% to fund "select" fire districts
